10,898 households & 31,402 individuals received over 193 tons of food through food pantry & monthly food distribution; Provided hygiene products for 598 individuals, and Crisis Relief for 488 individuals including utility, rent and medical assistance; Assisted 48 youth through youth education programs

Provided childcare services during 3,789 medical appointments, 154 junior enlisted parents participated in Operation Hero, 80 children enrolled in the Little Heroes Early Learning program; 700 served through the Diaper Pantry receiving food & diapers



ARMED SERVICES YMCA



342 youth participated in the Academic Success Program which includes tutoring, STEM Activities, Workforce Development, and College & Career Readiness programs



BOYS & GIRLS CLUB

32 at-risk youth in the Hopkinsville Group Home and Christian County Day Treatment Center received support such as counseling and engaging activities to help them address and overcome their challenges



Responded to 587 critical emergencies utilizing essential response equipment purchased with UWP funding

Real Men Read, Community Reader Day, and Cookies with Santa reached 4,920 students through volunteer led classroom reading sessions & 55 students participated in the Annual Spelling Bee



Provided dyslexia screenings, one-on-one tutoring, and advocacy for 109 individuals with reading deficiencies

•14,925 youth served in youth sports, summer camps, and after-school tutoring
•14,458 individuals supported through after-school meals, swim lessons, & adaptive aquatics
•5,389 participants engaged in Rock Steady Boxing, wellness seminars, and fitness initiatives

Provided confidential medical exams & interviews, and advocacy services to 202 children & their families who experienced sexual abuse and trauma. The 24/7, 365 day crisis line took 1,756 calls

PACS RSVP provided over 56,822 hours through 329 Senior Volunteers
PACS HDM delivered daily meals to 976 home bound senior citizens



431 disabled, low income, or elderly individuals received free legal services

2,784 individuals received case management to assist with housing stability
219 unhoused individuals received emergency shelter; 38 individuals secured permanent housing; 741 children received Christmas through the Angel Tree Program
25 kids attended summer camp; 36,386 meals served out of the Soup Kitchen
